## ORIGINAL ARCS ATLANTA SCHOLAR CEO OF SILICON VALLEY DIGITAL HEALTH COMPANY

Deborah Kilpatrick, Ph.D., a member of the Atlanta Chapter's first class of ARCS Scholars in 1992-93, is transitioning from her role as Chief Commercial Officer at CardioDx, a Silicon Valley personalized medicine company, to that of Chief Executive Officer at Evidation Health, a newly formed Silicon Valley digital health company.

Dr. Kilpatrick completed her Ph.D. in Mechanical Engineering with a Bioengineering focus at Georgia Tech in 1996. She was an ARCS Scholar during the 1992-1996 academic years. Her original research focus was cardiovascular disease and medical devices. Deborah has been awarded 17 patents, and presents invited lectures at Georgia Tech, California Polytechnic State University, and Stanford University.
